An important address, her first as President, issued during Catt's first term as President of the National American Woman Suffrage Association where she succeeded Susan B. Anthony. Also of importance because it coincided with Catt's founding of the International Woman Suffrage Alliance. The owner, Edith Davidson Harris, was the daughter of the philosopher and author William Torrey Harris, who was closely associated with Ralph Waldo Emerson, Bronson Alcott, and Thomas Davidson, and who also served as editor-in-chief of *Webster's International Dictionary*.
