

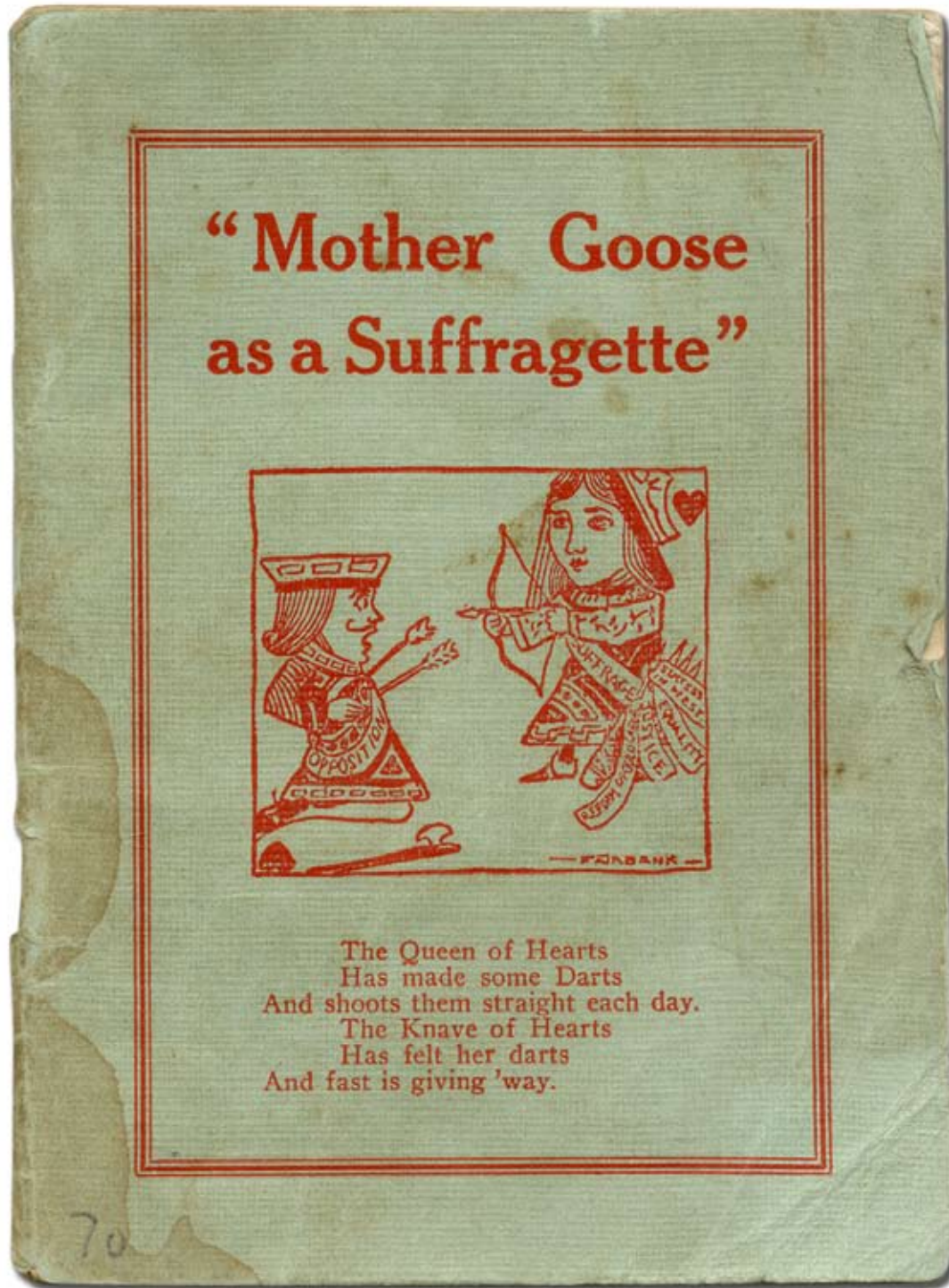

Little Boy Blue shouts for women's rights (because he esteems Child Labor Laws); Jack leaves Jill at the bottom of the hill; Humpty Dumpty represents conservative anti-suffrage advocates, etc. Includes a caricature of the Bull Moose candidate, Teddy Roosevelt, attempting to lead a woman into a voting booth.
