Collection of Cabinet Photographs of Wyoming and Utah, 1898-1900

A collection of 22 larger format cabinet photographs. 21 of the images are captioned on the verso, and show various dates between 1898-1900. Most are approximately 7" x 5" gelatin silver prints mounted on thick cards which are approximately 9" x 7". A little modest wear at the edges of the cards, a few images a little faded, but overall near fine. A very nice collection of images set mostly in Wyoming and Utah. The photographs, all taken outdoors, are about evenly split between sheep ranching in Wyoming (9 images) grazing, shearing, hauling wool, etc.); the others of other outdoor activities mostly one or more camping and fishing trips in a few different identified locations: near the North Platte River, 20 miles south of Saratoga, Wyoming near the border with Colorado; in Northern Utah, near Ogden Canyon; and a couple near Beaver Creek in Southern Utah. Images include strings

of recently caught fish on display (including a couple of images posed before a Conestoga-style wagon with a black cook in evidence), of Mrs. Maison landing a three pound trout from the N. Platte River, of a string of packed mules. Family names noted are Thornton, McDowell, and Maison. Very pleasing images, helpfully captioned, of turn-of-the -century life in Wyoming and Utah.
