

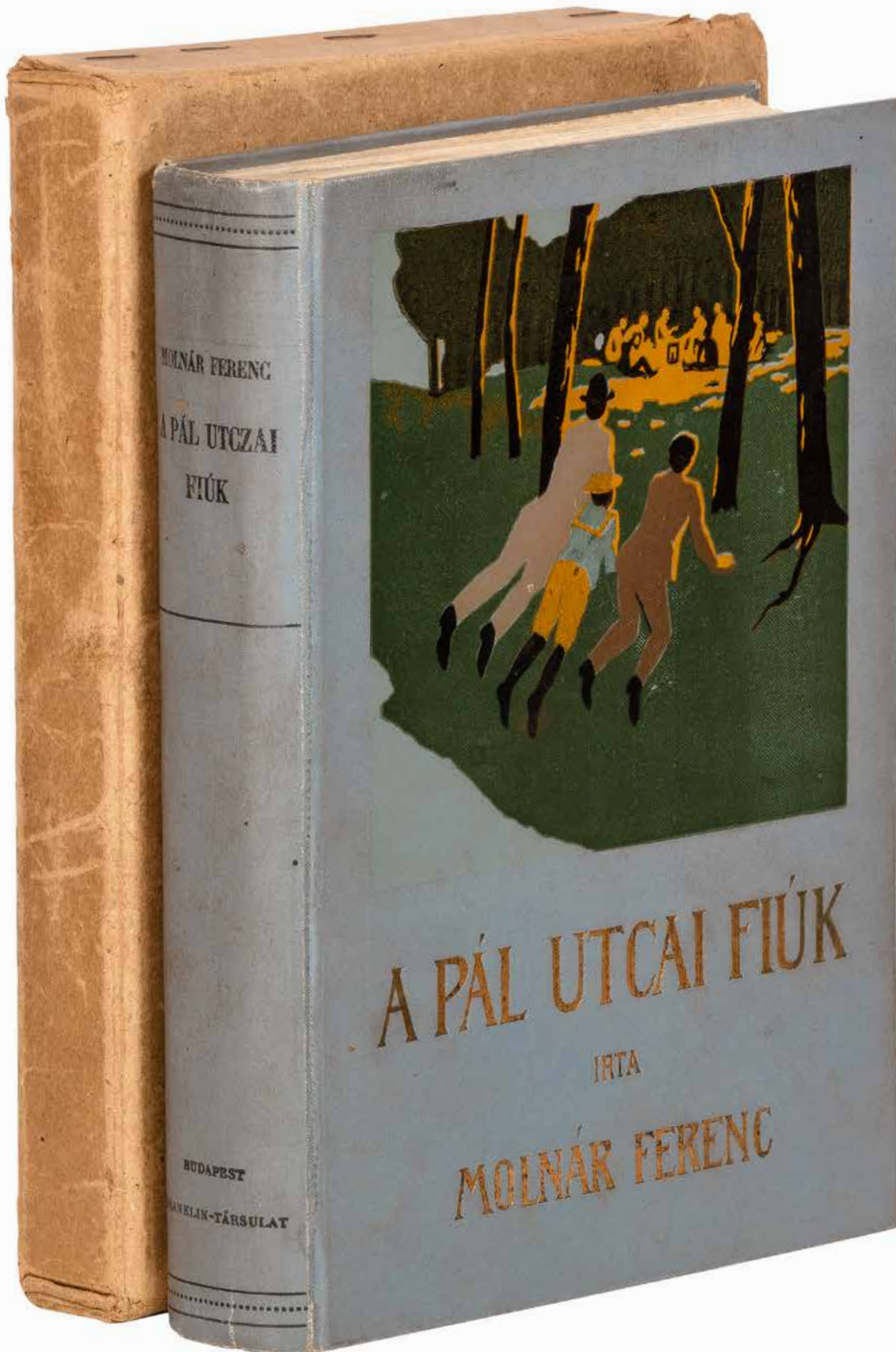

The book is slightly rubbed at the extremities and is near fine; there is a modest chip from one edge of the slipcase, detached but present, some modest wear, overall very good.

The first edition of Ferenc Molnár's juvenile novel, *The Paul Street Boys*, one of the most famous Hungarian novels, which was adapted to film on several occasions, probably most notably as *No Greater Glory* in 1934 directed by Frank Borzage. The novel for adolescents recounts two groups of boys in Budapest who defend their neighborhoods from each other, with tragic results. Molnar also wrote several other books that became movies including *Liliom*, which was the basis for, among other things, *Carousel*. [BTC#412402]
