A 1910-era nurse's bag produced by Sharp & Smith in Chicago. A leather case containing a variety of nursing implements. Very good with some rubbed leather and most of the original contents. The case was an early mass produced kit for nurses and included everything they would need for professional care in and out of a hospital. In a 1911 issued of *The Trained Nurse and Hospital Review*, included here, an advertisement for the 1911 bag is featured. This version of the bag featured more decorative stitching on the case, which is why we believe this bag is an earlier model. The ad reads, "The New Nurse's Bag - a complete equipment for the trained nurse. This bag is made of the best seal grain leather and leather lined." It then lists everything the bag comes with including a syringe, spare needles, and a glass catheter. This kit contains most of the origin contents, some unopened and in their original wrappers, and also some additional items presumably added by the owner of the bag.
