Broadside printed in red and blue on white paper. 10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 14". Partially affixed, probably at a relatively early date, to a thin piece of dark paper. Horizontal crease, a couple of tears, and small chips on two corner effecting no text, stable and very good. Tiny union printer's slug is too obscured from ink spread to read, but anecdotally it was printed in Scranton, Pennsylvania. Poster for the 1920 Presidential Election in 1920, between Republican Warren G. Harding and Democrat James M. Cox. An early example of mobilizing the votes of women. This was the first Presidential Election that women could vote in after the passage of the 19th Amendment. Very scarce. *OCLC* locates no copies. We haven't seen or referenced another. [BTC#420443]
