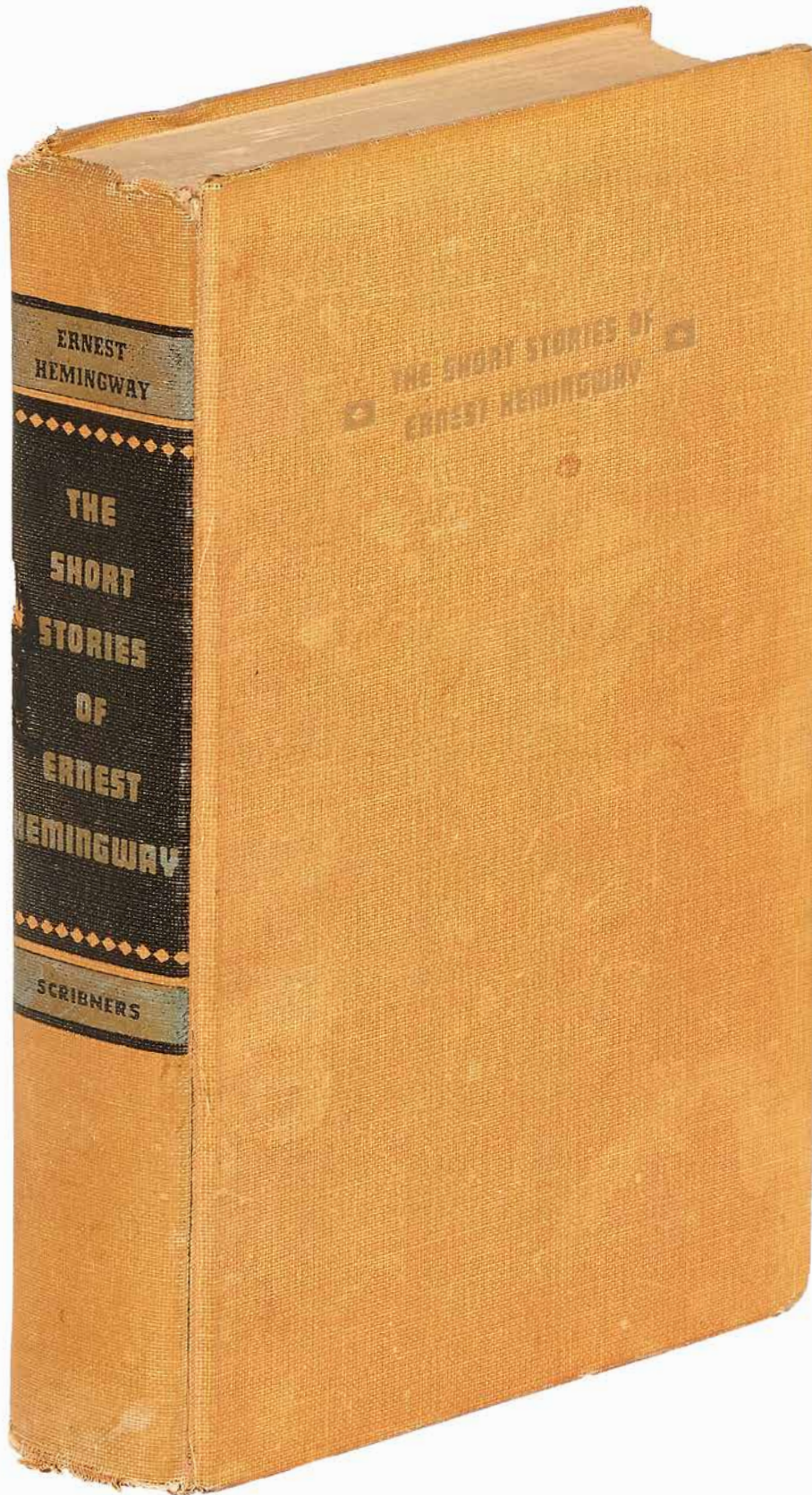

Inscribed to African-American author Albery Murray by Mary Hemingway, the widow of the author: "Hoping E.H. won't think me presumptuous - Best wishes to Albert Murray - Mary Hemingway N.Y.C. May 5, 1969." Murray wrote his Master's thesis at N.Y.U. *The Waste Land and The Sun Also Rises: A Comparative Study* in part on Hemingway's work. Murray later wrote several books on jazz, as well as a particularly important book about the deep South entitled *South to a Very Old Place*, an account of a journey written in a rhythmic stream of consciousness influenced by Eliot and Joyce, interspersed with visits with southern literary figures, and including a visit to Tuskegee where he recounts his student days there, and the beginnings of his lifelong friendship with fellow student Ralph Ellison. An interesting association.
