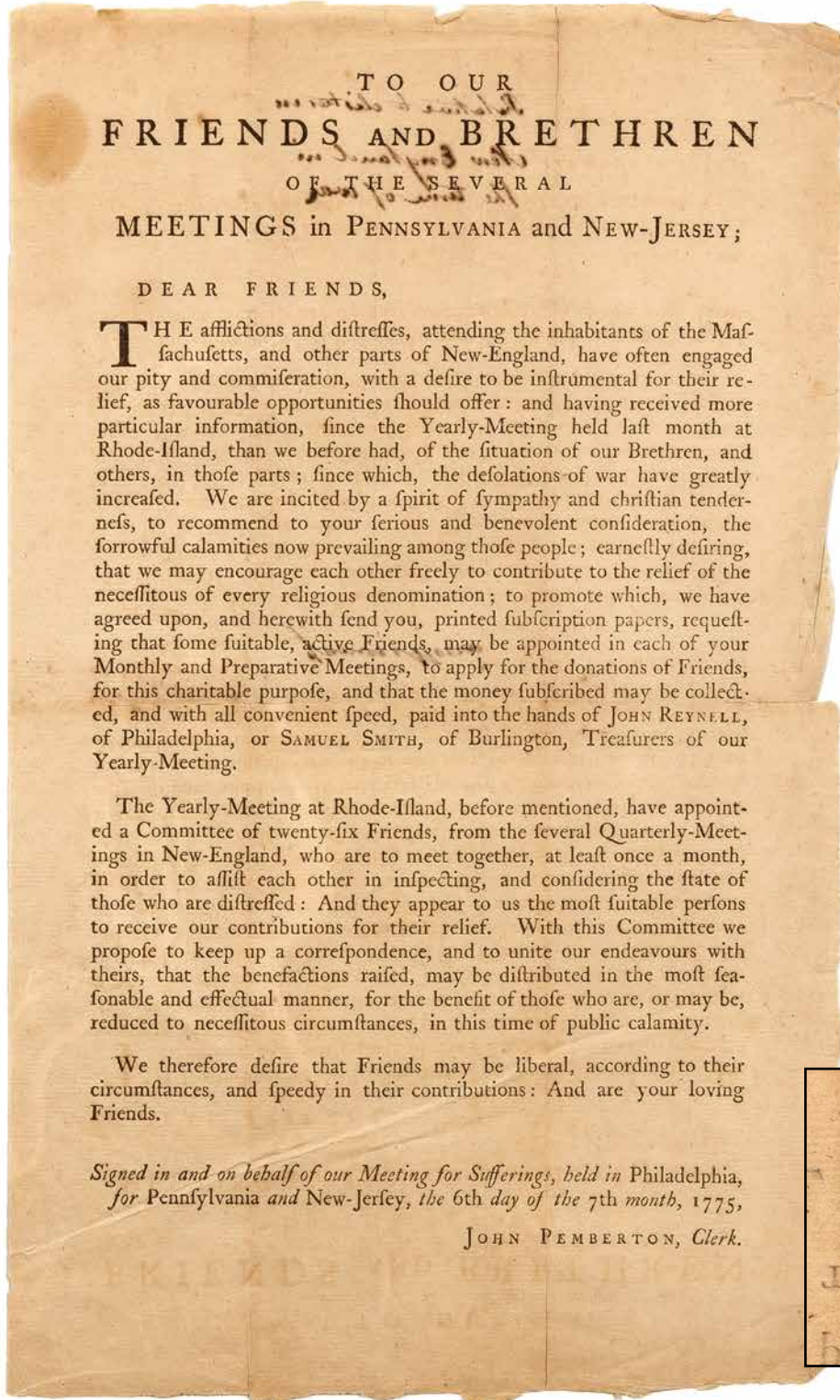


## [Philadelphia Yearly Meeting]

An appeal to help the inhabitants of Massachusetts suffering the “desolations of war,” printed just weeks after the Battle of Bunker Hill. A scarce revolutionary war broadside from the library of James Moon, a prominent Philadelphia Quaker who played a leading role in the long-running Quaker campaign against slavery in the 18th Century.

Folio (8" x 13.25"). Signed in letterpress: “John Pemberton, Clerk.” Very light folds (one horizontal, two vertical), near fine. The sheet is watermarked: “Work & Be Rich”. Titled and signed in manuscript by James Moon on the verso: “Relative to distress in New England in the time of war.” A very scarce broadside documenting: “The afflictions and distresses, attending the inhabitants of the Massachusetts, and other parts of New-England ...” *ESTC* W474330.
