

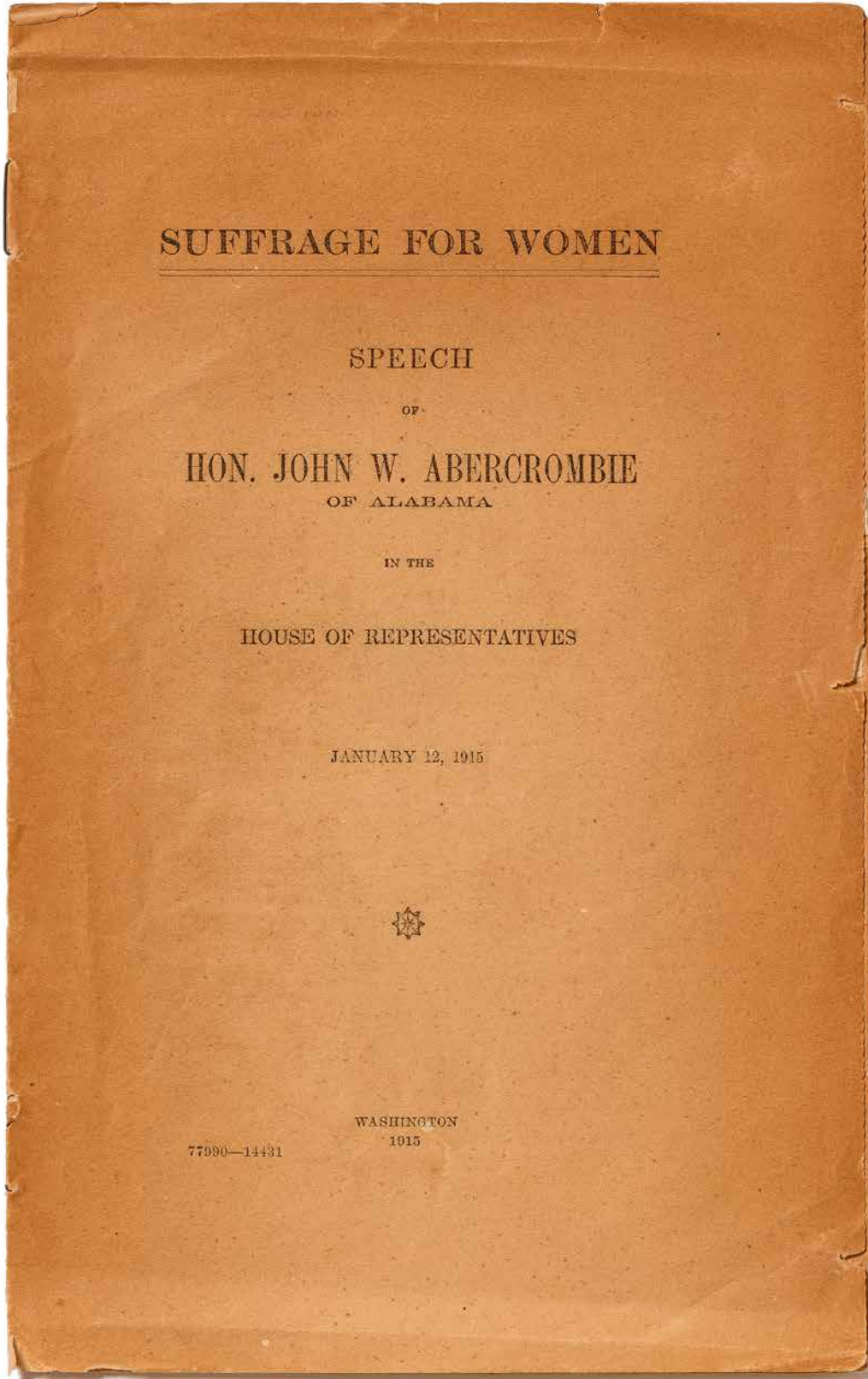

A speech given by Abercrombie in the U.S. House of Representatives in 1915 in which he claims to oppose Federal efforts on woman's suffrage on the grounds of States' Rights, while praising women and acknowledging their right to suffrage is imminent. Abercrombie served as president of the University of Alabama from 1902-1911, before becoming a U.S. Representative. Later he was appointed Acting Secretary of the U.S. Department of Labor from 1918 to 1920 and then Alabama Superintendent of Education from 1920 to 1927.
