

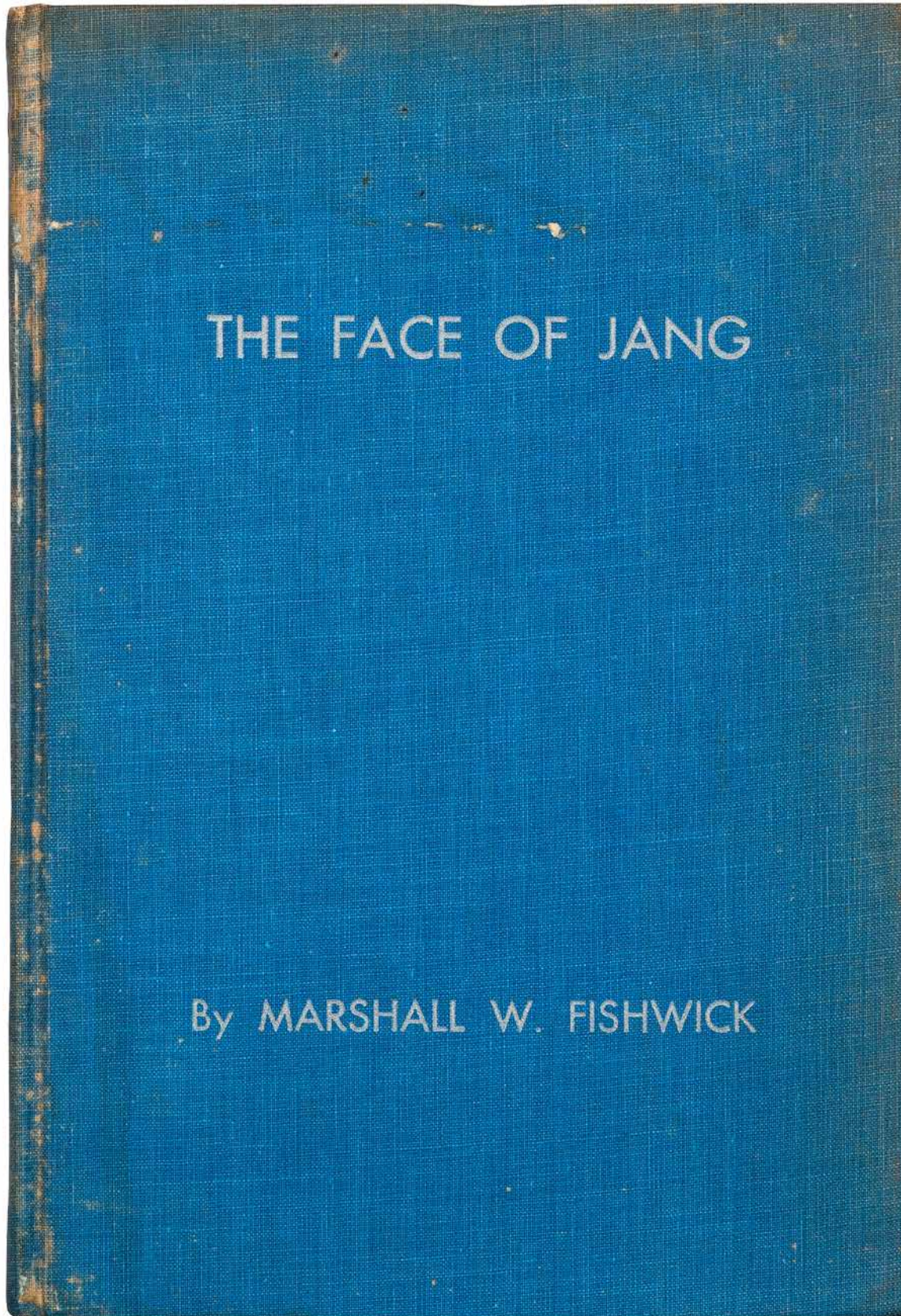


**Marshall William Fishwick**

James Southall Wilson was a consequential professor of English at the University of Virginia with whom Fishwick studied. Fishwick went on to become one of the founders of the multidisciplinary study of Popular Culture and established the journal *International Popular Culture* an uncommon title with a significant association.
