

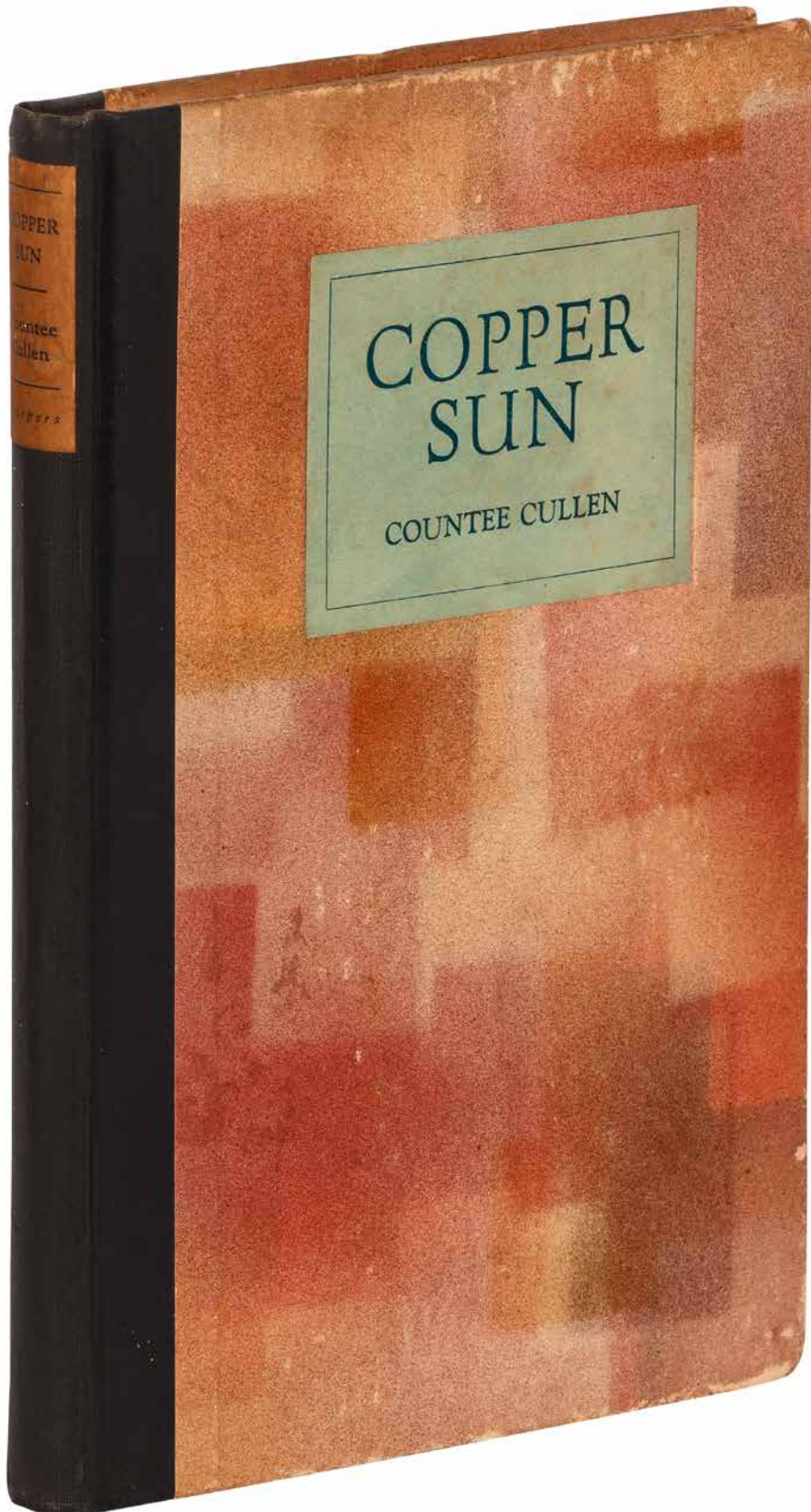

Julius Rosenwald was one of the owners of Sears, Roebuck and Company, who established the Rosenwald Fund, which supported the education of African-American children in the rural South. A notable association.
