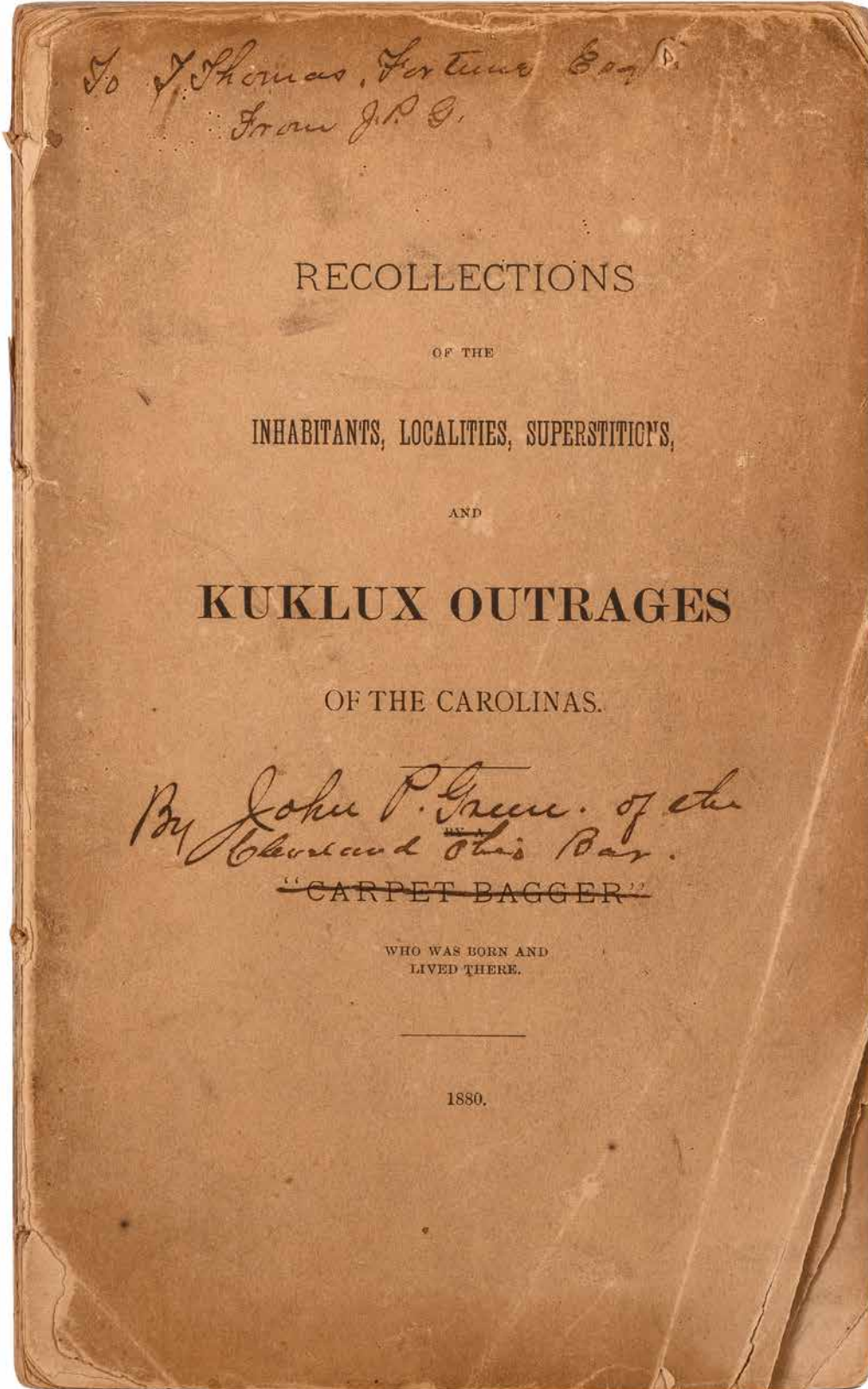


"Carpet Bagger" [John Patterson Green]

First edition. 205pp. Disbound. Lacking both broads, chips and creasing on the first few pages, and first two signatures detached but present thus good only. Inscribed by the author twice, once as "John P. Green of the Cleveland Ohio Bar" and the other as "J.P.G." Green was an African-American lawyer and politician, and one of the first African-American's to hold public office" in the state of Ohio. He later became Ohio's first African-American senator in 1892. Green inscribed this copy of the book to T. Thomas Fortune, Esquire, a civil rights leader and editor of the African-American newspaper, *The New York Age*. Fortune also edited and ghost wrote Booker T. Washington's *The Story of My Life and Work*. [BTC#424546]
