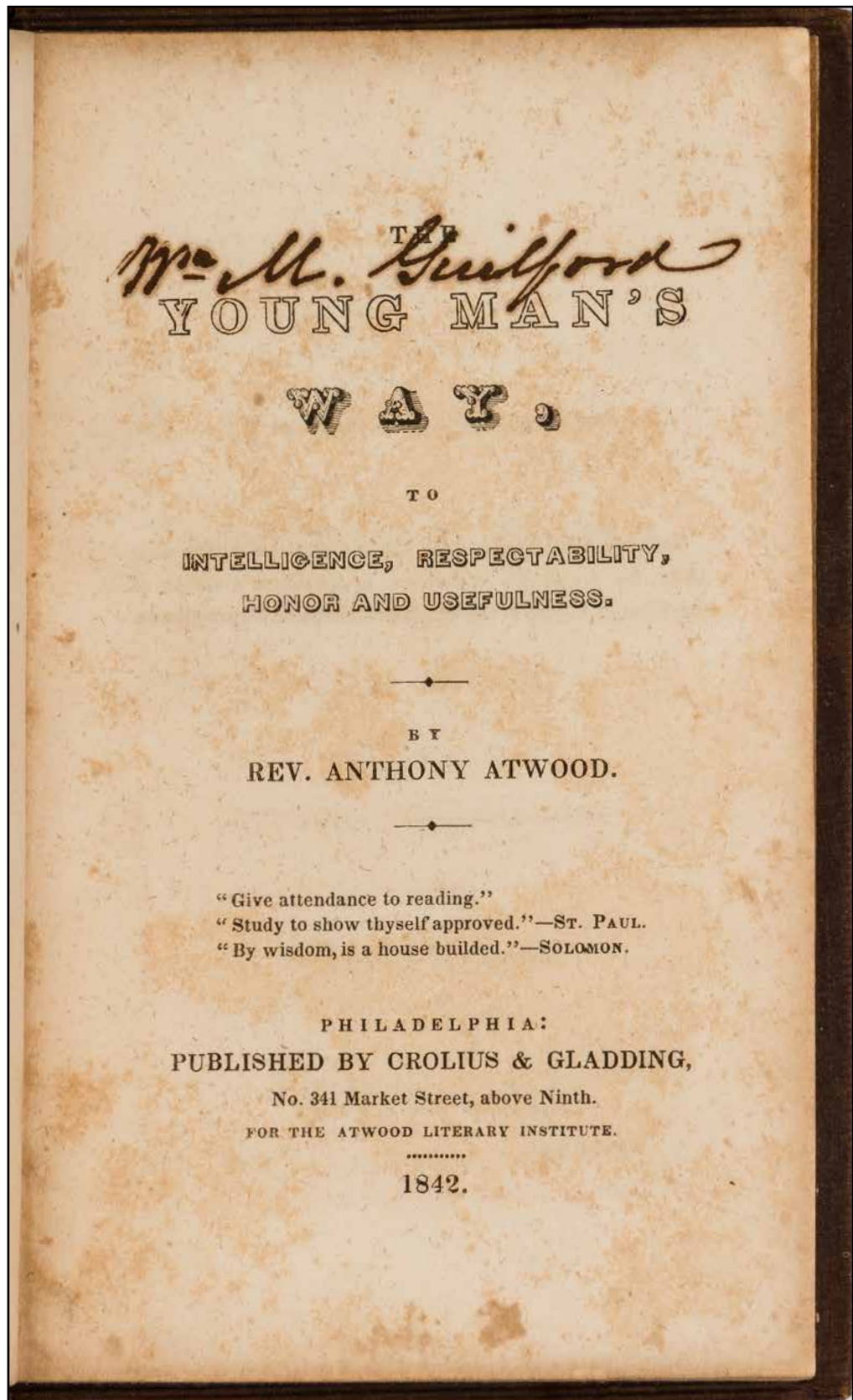

First editon. 12mo. Publisher horizontal purple cloth stamped in blind and titled in gilt. Embossed in the cloth on the front board: "Crolius & Gladding / Binders" (as well as repeated, upside down, on the rear board). Contemporary owner's name repeated twice (William Moore Guilford), a bit of scattered foxing in the text, spine uniformly sunned, very good or better. John D. Crolius was a binder in New York in the 1820s, this publishing combination appears to have published little more than a half dozen books, all between 1841-42. The owner, Guilford (b. 1812) became a prominent physician in Lebanon, Pennsylvania. *OCLC* locates four copies of the first edition. [\[BTC#425038\]](#)
