Illustrated broadside. Approximately 11" x 14". Modest chips in the corners, and a bit of age-toning, a very good example. The central image depicts Soglow's Little King seated in front of four paintings hung from an iron fence, as a couple and their dog view them, which include a cat eyeing up a fish, a man's legs, a flower in a pot, and a (probably nude) woman. In 1931 Jackson Pollack and Willem DeKooning in desperate financial straits, set up and sold paintings informally in Washington Square Park. Over the next few years, the Exhibition was organized and has continued to this day for over over 80 years, now held twice a year. This poster from the early days of the event and on thin card stock is unlikely to have survived in great numbers. Unrecorded in *OCLC*. [BTC#425969]
