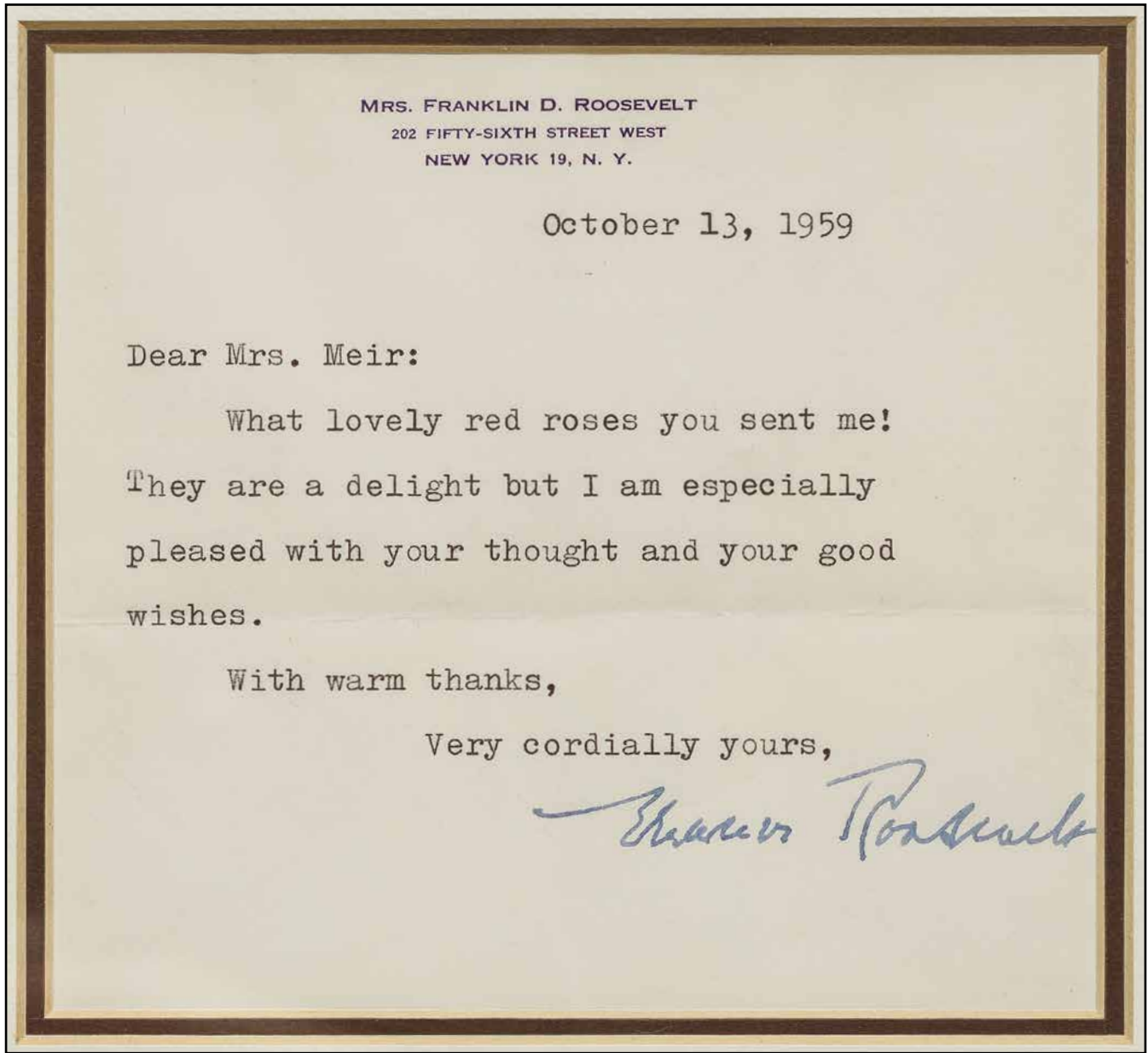


Eleanor Roosevelt

Typed Note Signed by Eleanor Roosevelt to Golda Meir in 1959

Typed Note Signed (“Eleanor Roosevelt”) to Israeli Foreign Secretary Golda Meir. The note is on Roosevelt’s New York stationery and dated October 13, 1959. Note is matted to 5¾" x 5½" and is glazed and framed with a picture of the two woman shaking hands. Unexamined out of frame but appears fine. Text of the note in full: “Dear Mrs. Meir: What lovely red roses you sent me! They are a delight but I am especially pleased with your thought and your good wishes. With warm thanks, Very cordially yours, Eleanor Roosevelt”. On the verso is a pocket with the original envelope free franked by Roosevelt and addressed to Meir at the Consulate of Israel in New York. The frame has an old Argosy Bookshop label on the verso. While the content of the letter is unlikely to send scholars scurrying to revise historical texts, it does represent a connection between two of the most important and iconic women of the 20th century.
