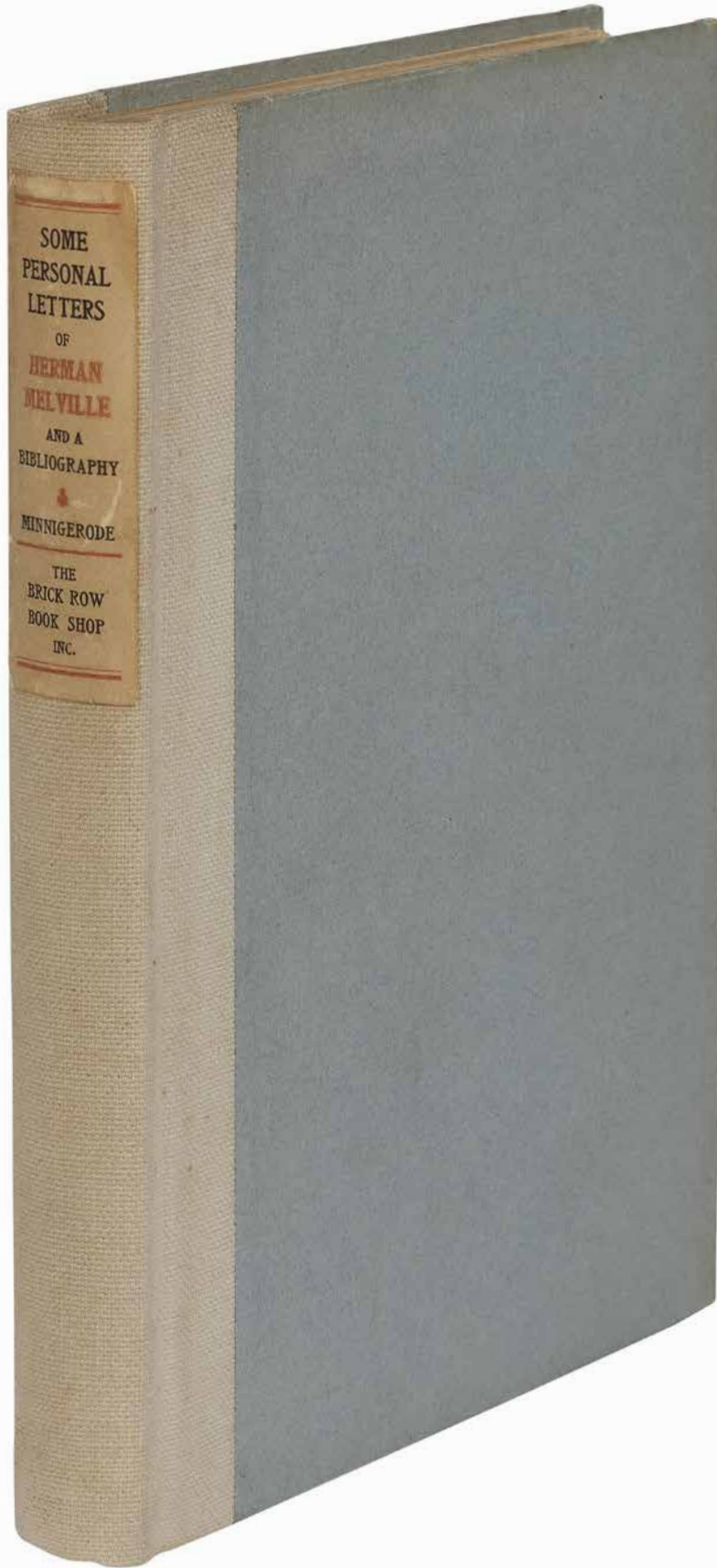


The Dedication Copy, Inscribed by the composer of *The Whiffenpoof Song*

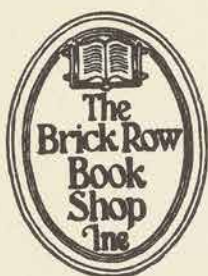

The Dedication Copy, Inscribed by Minnigerode to longtime Yale professor William Lyon Phelps, utilizing the printed dedication on the dedication page: “Respectfully dedicated, and Affectionately inscribed To William Lyon Phelps by a pupil of 1910, Meade Minnigerode. December 8, 1922.” “To William Lyon Phelps” is printed, the rest is in the hand of Minnigerode. Minnigerode was the founder of The Whiffenpoofs and composer of their towering anthem, *The Whiffenpoof Song* (“We are poor little lambs who have gone astray, Baa, Baa, Baa...”). [\[BTC#429348\]](#)
