First edition. Folio. Printed thick card boards. Splitting along the bottom of the joints and bumped at the crown, very faint small stain at bottom extremities, else very good. Warmly Inscribed by Freeman to Virginia state senator and HMS Titanic survivor Robert Williams Daniel: "To Robert

W. Daniel in warm appreciation of his service in preserving the spirit that made Virginia great. Douglas Freeman. Sept. 18, 1932." On the Titanic Daniel reportedly leapt into the water and was rescued by a passing lifeboat. Onboard the rescue ship Carpathia he met Eloise Hughes Smith, whose husband

had perished in the sinking, and who became his first (of three) wife.
