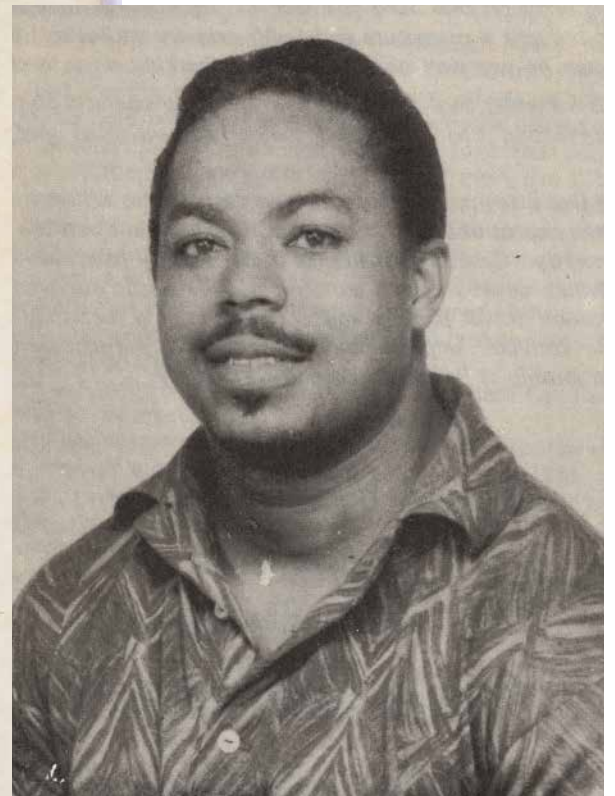
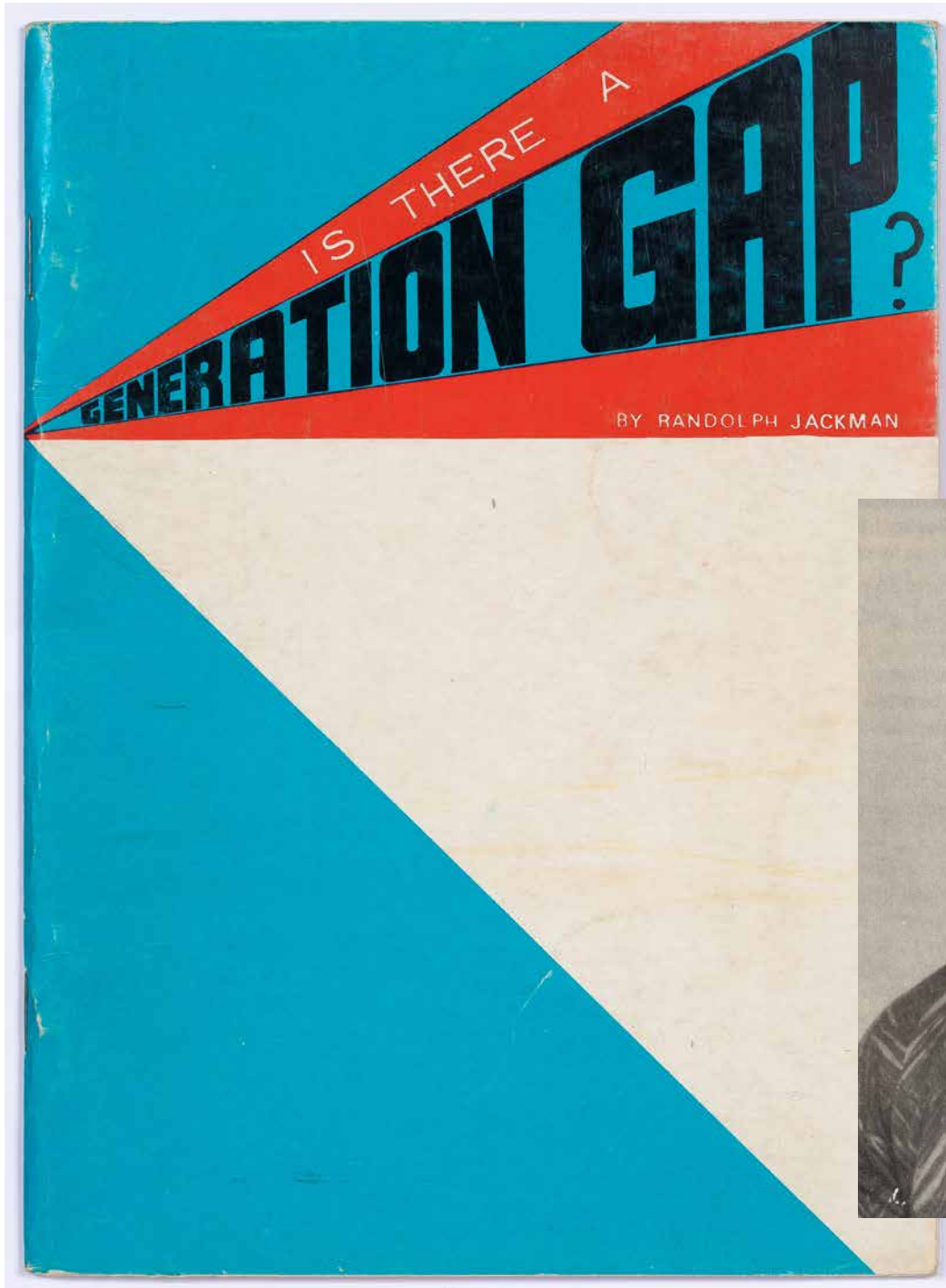

This edition was wirtten by Randolph Jackman a hitherto unknown artiste in the literary world. Born on the 4th of November 1932 of very poor parents in the town of Tunapune in Trinidad.

He received his early education at the Tunapuna Government Primary School where it is understood he achieved a brilliant career as an all round student. Poverty on one hand and lack of parental incentive and drive on the other brought a premature end to his primary education, and this at a period when he was well on the way to embarking on a teaching career.

He is versatile, cool and plesant in his daily contacts and helpful to many, comforting their frustrated minds irrespective of race, colour or religion.

As a first attempt, this novel can be described as brilliant, for in it he explores the depths of one of the most controversial subjects the world over. "The Generation Gap".
