First and presumed only edition. Octavo. 6, [2]pp. Photographic illustration of a cooking pot. Cord-tied photographic wrappers. Faint bend and a little age-toning on the wrappers, very good or better. Maudlin tribute and memorial to a slave and family retainer: "Old Granny was a negro and a slave, but we loved her and she loved us. Her skin was black but her soul was white..." and, reflecting on the past: "Those were happy days, and Granny was a large factor in our happiness. Heaven bless her! But the days are gone, and Granny is gone - gone with the dear 'Old South,' never, never to come again." We are generally not fans of the genre of nostalgia for posthumous slaves, but this pamphlet is rare and quite possibly unique. OCLC locates no copies. Provenance on request.
