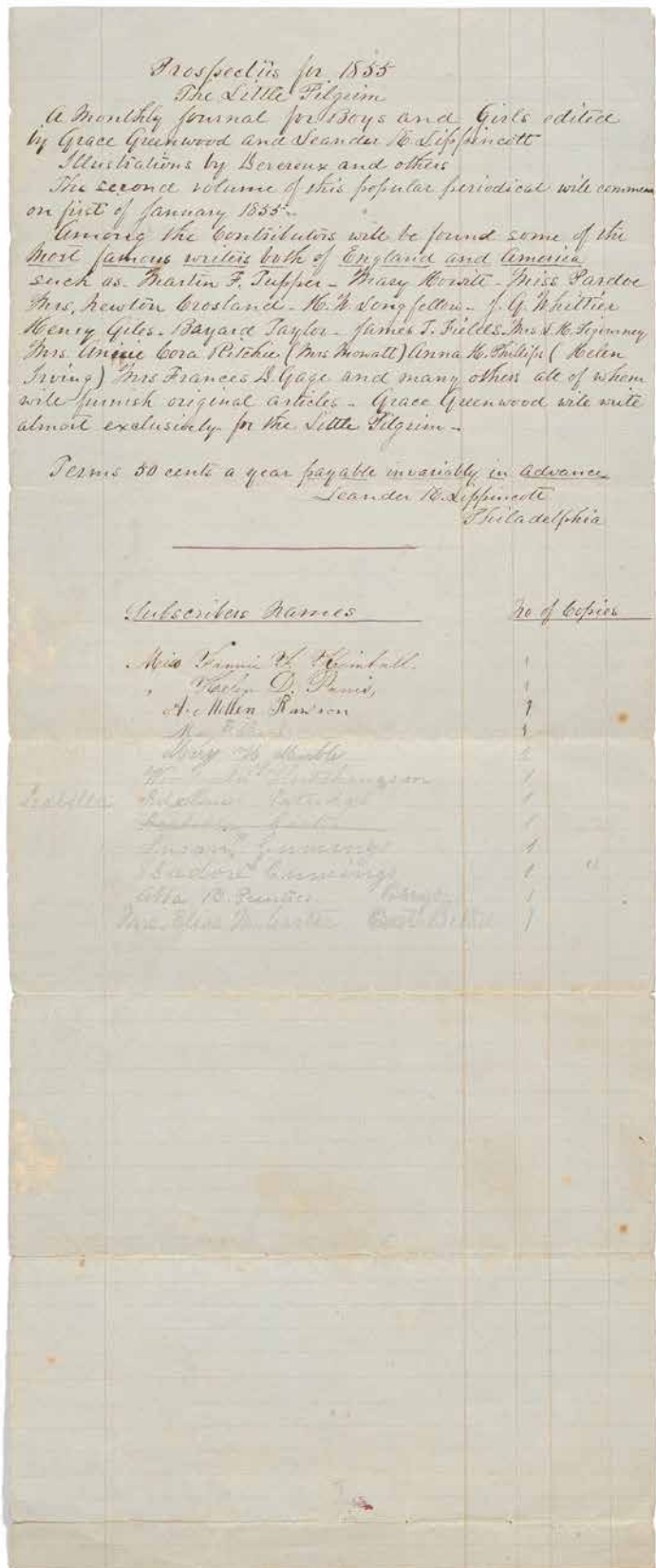

Handwritten prospectus and subscription sign-up sheet for the second year of the children's periodical *The Little Pilgrim*. Single lined leaf. Approximately 6¾" x 16". Tupper, Mary Howitt, Miss Pardoe, Mrs. Newton Crosland, H. W. Longfellow, J. G. Whittier, Henry Giles, Bayard Taylor, James T. Fields, Mrs. L. M. Sigourney, Mrs. Annie Cora Ritchie (Mrs. Mowatt), Anna H. Phillips (Helen Irving), Mrs. Frances D. Gage and many others all of whom will furnish original articles - Grace Greenwood will write almost exclusively for the *Little Pilgrim*. Terms 50 cents a year payable invariably in advance. Leander K. Lippincott, Philadelphia." The text is followed by a handwritten list of 11 or 12 (one crossed out), all of women, mostly it seems, from Maine. *The Little Pilgrim* was a magazine for children edited by Leander K. Lippincott and his wife Sarah Jane Lippincott (pen name Grace Greenwood). Greenwood was a prolific author, who aside from writing for children, supported abolition, and later on other social issues, but eventually dedicated herself largely to writing on the cause of women's rights. An interesting artifact of the this pioneering children's periodical, and representative of one of Greenwood's earliest works.
