And in "The Gnome and the Dragons," a master who can turn any whim into instant reality falls into a trap of his own making.

It is an enchanted world whose familiar paths--filled with unexpected twi lead to wonderfully entertaining conclusions and confirm John Gardner's place as a teller of tales for readers and listeners of every age.
